
## IFC SHORTCAST

#### Hello Fishermen!

I hope everyone is having a wonderful holiday season filled with health and happiness. In these times, some of the best things to do is get out and enjoy the outdoors. I'm blessed to be able to take people out on the water and show them the great fishing that we have in the Florida Keys. I feel that being on the water in the fresh ocean air is a great way to enjoy time during the pandemic. We had many trips get canceled due to the weather and COVID. But when we do get out, it has been great fishing.

The wintertime is considered the best time to target sailfish in the Florida Keys. This is mainly due to the abundance of ballyhoo showing up on the outer reef. The outer reef is the largest barrier reef in the Atlantic Ocean and is one of the main reasons the Keys are such a great fishing destination. With the colder water temperatures, the ballyhoo start to school along the outer reef. This attracts predator fish to feed on them. You can honestly catch anything from sailfish, dolphin, mackerel, grouper, snapper, tuna and even African pompano in ballyhoo showers. Here is a picture of Reef Bennett with his monster African pompano that he caught during the Islamorada Junior Sailfish Tournament. The pompano couldn't resist the live ballyhoo we pitched out on a 15lb spinning rod. We like to use 30lb leader and a 4/0 circle hook. This season has started out a little slower as far as sailfish fishing goes. Typically we get 5-10 shots at sails in a day. Hopefully we will get another push of sailfish this year. The next cold front may push in a new body of hungry sails and we will get back to our normal numbers of fish for this time of year.
